#### Marching Band (Fall Semester)

To be a member of the Karns High School Marching Band, the student must be enrolled in the correct Marching Band period during the fall semester. Each student must comply with all rules and regulations for that particular organization. The student agrees to attend all rehearsals and is required to attend band camp. Each member must meet all financial obligations and must attend all rehearsals, sectionals, and performances (competitions, parades, football games, etc). The directors must approve any absences from rehearsals or events in advance.

#### Fall Color Guard / Majorettes

As a specialized part of the marching band, students selected *by auditions* to the color guard/majorettes will enroll in the Fall Color Guard Class. This class will offer members of the Fall Color Guard /Majorettes the opportunity to master basic techniques in body movement, flag, weapons, and batons as well as expose the student to more advanced techniques later in the semester. This class will also prepare students to audition for the competitive Winter Guard.

#### Wind Ensemble/ Symphonic Band / Concert Band (Spring Semester)

To be a member of the Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, or Concert Band, the student must be enrolled in their respective band during the spring semester and must meet all financial obligations. Each student must comply with all rules and regulations for that particular group. The student agrees to attend all rehearsals and performances. All absences must be cleared with a director prior to the absence. Students are expected to maintain a high level of preparation throughout the spring semester. Private instruction from a specialist is highly recommended and encouraged. Private instructors can be recommended on request.

#### Indoor Percussion Ensemble (November - March/April)

The Indoor Percussion Ensemble is a select group with membership through audition and/or director invitation only. The student agrees to attend all rehearsals and performances. The student must have been a member of the fall marching band and must have met his or her financial obligations for the fall (exceptions through director approval only). Each member must meet all financial obligations (second-semester budget plus indoor fees) and must be a member in good standing of their respective band class.

Cooperative Fee for Indoor Drumline — TBA

#### Winter Guard (November - March/April)

The Winter Guard is a select group with membership through audition. The student agrees to attend all rehearsals and performances. The student must have been a member of the fall guard and must have met his or her financial obligations for the fall (exceptions through director approval only). Each member must meet all financial obligations.

Cooperative Winter Guard Fee — TBA

#### Jazz Band (Fall Semester)

The Jazz Band is a select group with membership through audition and/or director approval. The student agrees to attend all rehearsals and performances. Jazz Band meets during the Fall Semester for 90 minutes during the regular school day.

#### The Band Curriculum: A YEAR-LONG Course of Study

The successful development of our student musicians is a YEAR-LONG process. Performance opportunities offered during the academic year are designed to enrich students' overall academic experience, build life-skills, and reach their full potential as student musicians. Due to the sequential nature of the band curriculum, it is very important for student musicians to remain in the program for the ENTIRE YEAR. Exceptions will be made ONLY when there is a time conflict between the proper band class and courses necessary for graduation (with proper written notification from a guidance counselor or an administrator). Any student who does not satisfy these requirements will not be allowed to rejoin the band program without the director's approval. Any student who drops out of any of these organizations during the semester will not be allowed to rejoin at any time and must drop that specific class immediately or as soon as the administration deems possible. *The director and principal must approve any exceptions to the requirements above.* 



#### **Requirements for New Membership**

New members of the Karns High School Band must meet the following requirements before beginning their first semester in the high school band program:

- A positive recommendation from the previous band director (attitude, effort & ability)
- Attend the New Member Meeting (April 18) and Mandatory Fall Registration (May 22 or 23)
- Enroll in Marching Band Fall
- Enroll in the Spring Semester Wind Ensemble/Symphonic/Concert Band

**New Member Meeting** gives parents/guardians and students the "inside scoop" on the band program. Everything from band camp to boosters will be covered in this informational event. Come ready to take notes and ask lots of questions! One parent from each family is required to be present—it is that important!

**Mandatory Fall Registration** gives parents/guardians and students the ability to pay fees, correct contact information, receive marching show music, check out school instruments, etc. Every member and a parent of the Karns Band must attend one day of the mandatory fall registration.

#### **Requirements for Returning Members**

Returning members of the Karns High School Band must meet the following requirements before beginning their next semester in the high school band program:

- Directors recommendation
- Attend the Mandatory Fall Registration (May 22 or 23)
- Enroll in Marching Band Fall
- Enroll in the Spring Semester Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, or Concert Band

#### **Grading Procedures**

Band is a unique course at Karns High School. It has curricular requirements, just as any other academic discipline, but it also has out-of-class time requirements. The strength of our band program is the consolidation of these requirements into one performance-based, academic course of study. The level of commitment from each individual student is the driving force behind the organization and is reflected in the level of achievement reached by the individual and the program.

#### **Marching Band Rehearsals**

- The rehearsal schedule is normally set well in advance, allowing students to plan other activities and obligations around the established schedule. For Fall 2023, the marching band will rehearse on **Tuesdays** from 4:00 7:00 and Thursdays from 4:00 7:00 or 6:00 9:00.
- Punctuality is a trait that will serve you well in any endeavor. Plan to arrive at <u>least</u> 15 minutes early to any rehearsal.
- Rehearsals are **never canceled** due to inclement weather.
  - Students should dress for the weather at the time of rehearsal. Students are required to wear athletic shoes for rehearsals. Boots, Crocs, and/or sandals are **NOT** permitted.
  - Music lanyards, chalk, hats, sunglasses, and sunblock are also required materials for all rehearsals.
- Directors should be notified IN ADVANCE if a student is going to be absent from a rehearsal or performance. Absences from band rehearsals or performances are unexcused unless due to:
  - Personal illness
  - $\circ$  Death in the family
  - Important emergency
  - Special permission from the director obtained in advance by the parent or guardian.
- Students must exhibit consistent responsibility in these areas. Excessive absences <u>for any reason</u> may result in the student being removed from the performing group or band program altogether. *Non-emergency dental and/or orthodontist appointments should be made at times that do not conflict with rehearsals.*



#### **Rehearsal Attendance**

Band is a learning activity. Rehearsals, whether during or after school, are the means by which students learn, and by their very nature cannot be reproduced or made up. Therefore it is imperative that students be present unless the absence is absolutely unavoidable. Excessive rehearsal absences may result in the student not being able to perform at upcoming performances due to insufficient rehearsal time. This decision lies solely with the directors, with the standard being that the student not miss more than an average of one (1) rehearsal day/week. Any issues with attendance can and will be discussed with the student, parents/guardians, directors (and administration if need be) to make sure a fair ruling is made. Rehearsals are **not** optional and are heavily weighted in the student's final grade. To put it simply: Be in rehearsal.

#### **Performance Attendance**

All performances are viewed as tests. Performing is a learning experience that cannot be duplicated in a rehearsal hall or practice room. The level of concentration required in a public performance assists each student in developing an insight into his or her own level of performance. Performances are also an important evaluative tool, allowing comparison of a student's performance in relation to classroom objectives presented and with past performances. Absences from performances are only excused in the event of:

- Extreme emergency
- Serious illness or hospitalization of the student
- Death in the family
- Religious holiday
- Other reasons deemed excusable by the director.
  - The band director must approve all absences IN ADVANCE. *Unexcused absences* may result in the student being removed from the performing group or band program altogether. Absences from a class must follow the policies and procedures set forth by Karns High School and Knox County Schools.

#### **Grading Rubric**

The grading rubric for band class has been designed to evaluate each student's performance, quality of participation, daily attendance, and preparedness for rehearsals and performances. Each student is expected to be on time and to bring the proper equipment (pencil, music, instrument, coordinate sheets, etc.) to every rehearsal and performance. Grades will be determined by the evaluation of both individual performance and quality of participation in the program. Grade deductions will result from any of the following:

- Tardies from class, rehearsal, or performance
- Absence from rehearsal (unless the absence is excused)
- Unexcused absence from a performance

#### Attitude

- Those students who have a positive mental attitude, regardless of their individual skills, will always have a place in the Karns Band. Regardless of your ability, if your attitude is not positive and you are not doing your personal best to make the group successful, you should not be a part of this organization. In fact, students who do not project an attitude that is positive and cooperative will be given the opportunity to change their personal perspectives or leave the organization.
- Characteristics of a positive mental attitude include a generally cheerful outlook toward rehearsals and performances, cooperation in the preparation and maintenance of equipment and facilities, and an eagerness to do what is necessary to be successful. In short, the total band member is someone who is always willing to give his or her best for the good of the organization.

#### **Cooperative Fees and Fundraising Opportunities**

- There is a tremendous cost associated with the operation and maintenance of a total band program. With little or no financial support coming from Knox County Schools, the responsibility for meeting the financial needs of our band program rests on the shoulders of the band members and band boosters. These funds are an absolute necessity in order to have a meaningful and successful program.
- The directors develop a budget each year to cover expenses such as instructional staff, travel, music, visual design, instrument and equipment needs, maintenance/repairs, etc. This budget is carefully amended to be as efficient as possible while still meeting the needs of a thriving and successful band program. Priorities are set based on the needs of the students first. The final budget is then divided by the projected number of



students participating in the activity. The individual student's financial responsibility is referred to as the cooperative fee. All cooperative fees are based on one per family (to help families with more than one child in the band program).

- In an effort to reduce the out-of-pocket expense of cooperative fees, students and their families are asked to support the band through various fundraising activities. The band boosters will sponsor several fundraisers during the year. Fundraising is not mandatory, but strongly encouraged.
- Families with financial hardship will not be turned away from the Karns Band program. Fee waiver forms are available in the Karns High School office and online for those who qualify. Alternate payment schedules can also be worked out with advanced notice.

#### **Cooperative Dues List:**

  - Due Tuesday, January 9, 2024 \$50
    - School-Instrument User Fee: January 10, 2024 \$75
- 2023 Winter Guard Cooperative Dues: TBA
  - The payment schedule will be announced when Winter Guard begins.
- 2023 Indoor Percussion Ensemble Cooperative Fee: TBA
  - The payment schedule will be announced when Indoor Percussion begins.

#### **School-Owned Instrument Fee**

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- A small user fee of \$75 per semester is assessed to any student who uses a school-owned instrument. This fee is used to help cover the expense of maintaining each instrument. Percussionists are to provide all of their own sticks and mallets under the direction of the directors. Students who use a school-owned instrument must submit a completed rental contract with payment upon instrument check-out. Percussionists are responsible for this fee as well.
- It should be understood students will be assessed for all costs associated with the abuse and neglect of instruments/equipment left in their care. This includes the replacement of the instrument/equipment due to loss or theft.
- Any damage will be repaired at the student's expense

#### **Band Uniform Guidelines**

#### Summer Uniforms:

This uniform consists of a blue band polo with the band logo. Each student is also required to have a pair of khaki shorts. This will serve as the dress for at least the first two to five football games. The shirt will also be required as part of the dress on away trips.

- Blue Band Polo: Each member is required to have at least one blue band polo. They will be available for \$27 each. <u>Please indicate the student's shirt size on the emergency form.</u> No money will be collected until shirts have been delivered (check or money order made out to Karns High School Band).
- Additional shirts will be available for purchase by family members to show your affiliation with and support of the band at ballgames and competitions.



#### **Guard and Majorette Uniforms**

The guard and majorette uniforms will be determined by the directors in consultation with the visual design coordinator and instructors. Color guard members will purchase their own special types of shoes, warm-up suit, flag bags, and carry-on bag. Prices are TBA and will be ordered during band camp.

- The Directors will make all final decisions regarding the style, color, and fabric of uniforms. Student suggestions are welcome and will be considered.
- Uniforms for Indoor Percussion and Winter Guard will be determined by instructional staff and directors. Members will be responsible for all costs associated with the uniforms.

#### **Traditional Uniforms:**

Each student will be issued a band coat and pants for the best possible fit from the current inventory. Uniforms will be issued at the beginning of the fall semester. Do not leave the uniform in cubbies/lockers unless instructed to do so. Do not leave your uniform in an unlocked vehicle unattended. This could be a very expensive mistake! Replacement Cost: Coat - \$350, Bibbers - \$125.

Each student is responsible for keeping up with all parts of the uniform. Uniforms will have to be properly and neatly hung after each use and dry cleaned when needed. No alterations are allowed to the uniform without the director's permission. The material should NEVER be removed from the uniform. No one is allowed in the uniform room without permission from a uniform officer or the directors. Abuse or neglect of the uniform may result in costly repairs or replacement as well as removal from the performing group. Any costs associated with the damage or loss of any uniform part are the responsibility of the student and parents/guardians. Remain in full uniform at all times at performances, unless otherwise directed.

Other items you will need are as follows:

- Black "DrillMaster" band shoes: Shoes will be ordered at band camp, Lunsford's Music or Rush's Music. Cost is approximately \$35.
- Tall black dress socks
- White gloves.
  - Purchase in the band office for \$5/pair
  - Each band member except percussion and color guard is required to have at least one pair of gloves.
  - Woodwinds with open keys will have to cut the ends from the fingers.

Section leaders will check with each person in their section to make sure each has his or her instrument and all parts of their uniform. *No T-shirts, hats, or any type of clothing with alcoholic beverages, drugs, or other vice advertising are to be worn during any band activity.* 

#### Rules for Classroom/Rehearsal/Performance/Trips

Karns High School Band operates under the rules and regulations set forth by Knox County Schools and Karns High School. These rules can be found in the student handbook issued to each student at the beginning of the school year. In addition, certain classroom and rehearsal rules are necessary to maintain a safe and productive work environment. Each student is expected to comply with all rules set forth in terms of participation in the band. Any student who fails to abide by the rules will be disciplined accordingly. Flagrant disregard for rules will result in point deductions, extra work assignments, detentions, and/or removal from the band program. All punishments will be in accordance with established rules of Knox County Schools and Karns High School.

#### **Classroom Procedures**

- Students should treat other students, staff, and directors with respect at all times.
  - There should be silence when a director gets on the podium.
  - CELL PHONES should not be used when a director is instructing the ensemble without explicit permission from the director.
  - Players should have all materials needed at all times. Pencils, mutes, reeds, mouthpieces, and all other required materials should be with each student every day.
  - Talking during rehearsals must be kept to a minimum. Talking should always be about the music we are studying and should never be a distraction to the conductor or other students.
- Reed players should have at least one spare reed at their seat during rehearsal.



- Cases should be left in the instrument storage rooms during rehearsal time.
- At the end of rehearsals put all of your equipment away correctly. Music that is not being taken home should be placed in the proper place with your instrument.
- Problems of an individual nature (missing music, problems with instruments, etc.) should be taken care of outside of class time, not during.
- Percussionists should each have a stick/mallet bag with a collection of:
  - Snare sticks
  - Acrylic Mallets
  - Hard Rubber Mallets
  - Soft Rubber Mallets
  - Cord Mallets
  - Yarn Mallets
  - Timpani Mallets
- Percussionists during marching season need to make sure they have all of the required equipment needed to perform the assigned instrument.
- Percussion equipment is to be put away at the conclusion of rehearsals. Timpani and mallet instruments should be covered. Small equipment should be returned to the percussion storage room.
- Do not leave money, purses, wallets, or other valuables unattended during rehearsals or during the school day. We are not responsible for valuables left in unsecured areas.

#### **Instrument Care**

School-owned instruments become the responsibility of the student to whom they are issued. A small user fee is assessed to any student who uses a school-owned instrument (\$75/semester). See Mr. Brady for a School-Owned Instrument Rental Form. This form should be completed and returned with the user fee on the first day of classes each semester. Any damage will be repaired at the student's expense.

Individual instruments must always be maintained in top playing condition. Always show the directors your instrument before taking it in for repairs. Remember that horseplay can cause damage to instruments and equipment. Be careful with your own instrument and place it out of harm's way if it is necessary for you to put it down.

#### **General Rules**

- Be courteous and respectful at all times.
- No PDA while in association with the band program in any capacity, which is always.
- Make sure your name is on all equipment (shoes, instrument case, uniform bag, etc.).
- All band members are to remain until the band is dismissed.
- Leave your valuables at home when possible.
- Flip-folders and music should be taken to all football games.
- Always do what chaperones ask without question.
- Keep your language clean.
- Always cheer for the football team and other bands.
- The purchase, use, or possession of narcotics or alcohol in any form is strictly prohibited. This is a zero tolerance policy and will result in immediate severe consequences.
  - If the student is taking a prescription drug, the directors must be notified in advance.

#### **Game Day Rules**

- Do not wear hats in the stands or with your uniform, except the regular marching band hat. If it is cold, stocking caps, earmuffs, or something for warmth is permissible.
- There is to be no random playing in the stands.
- The band will remain standing during the game.
- No screaming/arguing. Yell for the team not at each other.
- No one is allowed in the band stands that is NOT a current band member
- Band students will be limited to the Band Room, Auditorium, and Band Hall between school dismissal and game.
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#### **Bus Rules**

- Answer roll call for yourself only with a "Here, sir" or "Here, ma'am."
- Do not change buses.
- Keep noise to a minimum. No screaming, radios, speakers, sing-alongs, etc.
- Do not play your instrument on the bus.
- Do not throw anything out of the windows. Keep arms, head, etc. inside at all times.
- Put trash in garbage bags when done with them or at the end of the trip.
- When we return, be sure to say "Thank you" to the driver and chaperones. Remember to close windows.
- At away games and competitions, you must return with the band, unless your parents/guardians pick you up in person. Parents/Guardians must provide a signed permission note for the directors in advance.
- Get all equipment off the truck when we return to the school. EVERYONE HELPS UNTIL IT IS DONE!

#### **Competitions and Festivals**

- Competitions, festivals, and other adjudicated activities are important features of the Karns Band program. It is through these activities that we obtain valuable feedback about our progress as individuals and as a program. Although our season is not defined by anyone 's opinion of our performance, it is important that we learn the value of giving maximum effort and standing by the results as our best possible effort that day.
- Competitive performances are packed with emotion. Because of the amount of time, work, and discipline required to produce award-winning performances, we develop great camaraderie within the organization. We share in the hardship, discomfort, fatigue, oppressive heat, chilling cold, long bus rides, disappointment, tears, success, and joy.

#### **Individual Opportunities**

- East Tennessee School Band and Orchestra Association (ETSBOA) and Tennessee Secondary School Band Directors' Association (TSSBDA) sponsor several events throughout the school year. These give students the opportunity to excel individually on their instruments and to receive recognition for their musical achievements.
- A list of opportunities will become available when the respected association releases dates and fees. To be eligible for auditions and/or participation, students must be members in good standing of the Karns High School Band and pay the audition fee. There are always outstanding musicians in the Karns Band, and we strongly encourage widespread participation in these activities.

#### **Private Lessons**

- Private lessons are essential to developing an outstanding musical organization. Students engaged in private instruction with a professional show rapid improvement in individual musicianship. As these students improve, their excitement about practicing increases, they continue to improve, and they become stronger contributors to the overall success of the band.
- Private instruction has a great impact on the individual student and on our band program both this year and in the future. Directors will assist you, if needed, in selecting a private instructor. The key to satisfactory results from private instruction is to start as soon as possible and practice the material outside of the lesson time.

#### **Student Leaders**

- Section leaders and Drum Majors are a group of student leaders that work with the directors in an advisory capacity.
  - Eligibility for a student leadership include being full participants in the band program (both semesters) while having an exemplary attitude, loyalty, dedication, and willingness to give their personal time for the betterment of the Karns Band.
  - All section leaders will also go through an application and interview process required for selection.
- Directors select leaders on the basis of music and marching ability, service, dedication, loyalty, attitude, and leadership qualities. All student leaders will carry out the policies of the band, directors, school, and school administrators to the best of their abilities.
  - Any time you question or disagree with specific instructions from a student leader, please avoid confrontation and discuss the matter with the directors as soon as possible.



- Student leaders do not handle money or fund-raising merchandise for any other student and cannot be held responsible.
- Student leaders cannot give you permission to miss a rehearsal or performance, be tardy, or leave early.

#### **Instructional Staff**

• Anyone on the staff of the Karns Band has been selected due to the skills and qualities they possess and for the benefit they can bring to the program. They should be respected in the same way as the directors.

#### Chaperones

Chaperones are also extensions of the authority of the directors. Without the dedication of our chaperones and other adults that assist the band, we could not travel or perform in the way we do. They work hard and the only payment they receive is our appreciation. Be respectful, polite, cooperative, and remember the words "Please" and "Thank You."

- Chaperones will ride nearer to the back of the bus and directors are in the front of the bus on all trips.
- If you disagree with something a chaperone asks you to do, you are not to argue with them. You are to do as you asked and then inform a director as soon as possible. This policy will be strictly enforced.
  - In the extremely unlikely event that a chaperone's instruction would cause you to violate civil law or moral standards, the student should ask to be taken by that chaperone to the director immediately.
- If a chaperone has to report a student for being uncooperative, disrespectful, or for any other reason, that student will be subject to severe disciplinary action.

#### Parental/Guardian Involvement

Parents/Guardians are an important part of the Karns Band and have a vital role to play. Without the assistance and cooperation of band parents/guardians, there would be no chance for the level of success we want the band to reach. There are many things parents/guardians can do.

- Attend Karns Band Boosters meeting (First Tuesday of every month at 6:30 PM in the Karns High School Band room or auditorium)
- Volunteer for parent committees. There are many different tasks with which we need your assistance and everyone can find their niche.
- Be supportive of the band program and your child's participation by:
  - Assisting your child to be prepared and punctual for every rehearsal and performance.
  - Notifying directors if your child is to be absent or late for a performance or rehearsal. This should be done in advance unless there is an absolute emergency.
  - Encouraging your child to practice at home and help them find a quiet place to do so.
  - Show your interest and support in your child's music study by enthusiastically attending every performance possible as a chaperone or audience member.
  - Discuss with directors and staff anything that will help them understand and better serve your child.
  - Arrange for private lessons for your child, if at all possible.
- We welcome visitors to rehearsal but request they remain quiet so as not to disturb the focus of the students or staff. Cheering at appropriate times is welcome!
